


Habitat Homeowners Celebrate Their Final Payment

PAID IN FULL. SATISFIED. FINAL PAYMENT. That's how the file reads after 22 years and 10 months of regular, affordable mortgage payments.

With a simple application in late 1991, the Butler family started their journey toward homeownership. Construction of the Osceola Mills home took most of 1992, and engaged dozens of community volunteers, mostly from St. Paul's United Methodist Church in State College.

John, Anna and their son and daughter, then ages 5 and 8, moved into their new family home in early 1993. "I remember doing sweat equity alongside the volunteers," commented John at their recent meeting with Habitat. "It was amazing to see so many give their time and energy to help our family." Continued Anna, "Building and buying a home with the help of Habitat for Humanity of Greater Centre County was a remarkable experience for our family."


